Recycling scrap tower angles to construct 9x6 metre shed!

To maintain the healthiness & service worthiness of costlier equipment, it is important to store these in a safe indoor space, protected from dust & rainwater. It was decided to build a shed to store the distribution division inventory worth Rs. 40 crores, however the estimated cost of construction was exceeding the budget.

Our internal team decided to reuse the dismantled scrap tower angle at Sarsola and used it in the shed construction work. By doing so, they managed to save approximately Rs. 3.75 lac.
