Dahisar DSS is surrounded by creeks and is home for different kinds of reptiles. On January 25th around 14:45 hrs. a snake was spotted inside Dahisar DSS moving towards security cabin and all workers /staffs were instantly alerted. The snake then diverted its route and entered into a hole near the HT cable drum, leaving the tail exposed. We were unable to identify the snake whether it is venomous or not.

Thereafter, snake rescuer was called immediately and security guard was alerted to keep eye on the snake. The rescue team took more than 45 mins and meanwhile the snake went inside a hole and escaped. We waited for the snake to come outside but there was no movement. We later found that the hole is connected to the drain and came to a conclusion that the snake might have escaped via the drainage line. We alerted all workers and security guards to stay alert and not to roam without enough lighting.

The very next day round the same time the snake was spotted again and we immediately called the rescuers. Fortunately, the rescuer was nearby and arrived at the spot within 10 min. After 10 mins of search, the rescuers were able to pull out the snake and amazed to see the size of the snake.

The rescuer then identified the snake as **Russell's viper** (daboia in hindi) which is extremely venomous and the length was found to be 3 ft. 11 Inch.

The rescuer took the snake for releasing it in jungles of Virar. Finally, the safety of both workmen and the snake was ensured and a new home for the snake was ensured which was away from concrete jungle and human interference.
